Go to transfer.org and enter courses taken at your current or previous school(s) and find out immediately how the courses transfer for credit to another school of your choice.

CAS – THE GATEWAY TO INFORMATION

The days of waiting forever to receive course information, transfer credit comparisons, and degree progress from the registrar's office are over. With the Course Applicability System (CAS), you can find all of this information online.

WHAT IS CAS?

CAS is a joint project of the Ohio Board of Regents, Miami University, and the Arizona Board of Regents. Using the World Wide Web, CAS assists students, advisors, faculty, and administrators from two-year colleges and universities to obtain consistent and accurate information about transfer courses and their applicability toward degree completion. The participating institutions in Ohio include all of the public institutions as well as some of the private institutions.

HOW IT WORKS

Finding course descriptions, academic program information, transfer equivalencies, and assessing current program progress is now only a click away. Just log onto the CAS web site (transfer.org) and select the institution(s) of interest. Surf around and compare how participating institutions' courses transfer to another participating institution, view academic programs course by course, and estimate your graduation date by determining what courses you have left to complete.
